Perkins Wm F Jamaica In the Name of God Amen William F Perkins of the Parish of Thelawny in the County of Cornwall and Island of Jamaica Practitioner of Physic and Surgery being in sound mind but of grievous bodily sickness do make this my last Will and Testament hereby revoke all former Wills or Codicils at any time heretofore made by me and declare this to be my sole last Will and Testament I direct that my just debts and funeral expences shall be paid and hereby give and bequeath all my real estate consisting of one moiety of a lot of land situate in <sup>St. John</sup> Winton in the Town of Palmville in the aforesaid Parish of Thelawny with a Dwelling House and out offices thereon erected and built fronting the Sea to my two daughters Elizabeth Perkins of the City of London in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and Caroline Perkins now of the Parish of St. Ann in the Island of Jamaica aforesaid in equal moieties share and share alike and further give and bequeath a bond for eighty pounds due to me by my Son Cyrus F Perkins being a debt unto my Sons the said Cyrus F Perkins Henry Perkins and Phillip Perkins to be divided in equal third parts among my said Sons and further direct that my Executors shall permit my friend Miss Louisa Vanzee to reside in my said house rent free for the remainder of her life on default thereof to pay to her weekly the Sum of Five Shillings Current Money of Jamaica as she may select and hereby bequeath to my Son the said Cyrus F Perkins my clothes (except the remainder of my furniture) to my friend Miss Louisa Vanzee and the rest Residue and remainder of my personal Estate unto my aforesaid three Sons Cyrus F Perkins Henry Perkins and Phillip Perkins and my friend Miss Louisa Vanzee to be Equally divided among them and hereby nominate and appoint my said friend and bequeath a parcel of ~~land~~ <sup>land</sup> in the Parish of Thelawny aforesaid
