## LLOYD HARRIS IS DEAD; A CANADIAN FINANCIER

Was Prominent Dominion Manufacturer—Headed Its War Mission to Washington.

BRANFORD, Ontario, Sept. 27 (A).— Lloyd Harris, a prominent manufacturer and financier, died here tonight. He suffered a paralytic stroke last Friday.

Lloyd Harris had many important manufacturing interests. He was President of the Russell Motor Car Company of Toronto, the Under-Feed Stoker Company of America and the Canada Glue Company of Brantford. He was Vice President of the Willys-Overland Company of Toronto, of the Steel Company of Canada and the Dominion Power and Transmission Company, to mention only a few of the many corporations with which he was associated. To Americans Mr. Harris is perhaps

hest known as the Chairman of the Canadian War Mission and United States Representative on the Imperial Munitions Board at Washington from Oct. 1917 to Nov. 1918. For the next twelve months he was Chairman of the Canadian Mission in London. Mr. Harris was born in Bearmsville, Ontario, 58 years ago.
